Use this sentence as a start to an opening paragraph to a story.
 "As the rocket door slowly creaked open, I peered outside to find..."
 Try and build suspense and use description.

Write a simile poem about space.
 Put a different simile on each line.
 Eg. "Stars as twinkly as the most expensive diamonds."

"Children should be able to stay up as late as they want."
 Write a balanced argument with points for and against whether this should happen.



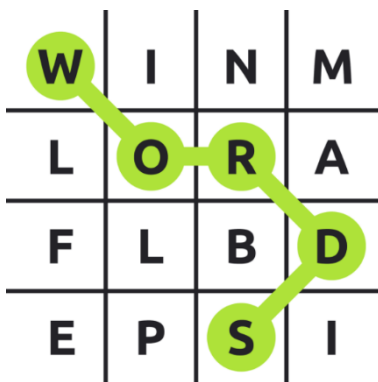
ASTRONAUT
