Maths



Today I would like you to have a go at writing the following numbers using numerals.

Use what you know about place value.

e.g. Three thousand, four hundred and sixty-five would be written like this - 3465

Th	H	T	U
3	4	6	5

You could just write the numbers or copy the grid and write it like that.

1. Three hundred and fifty-five.
2. Six thousand, seven hundred and seventy-nine.
3. Eight thousand, nine hundred and thirty-two.
4. Seven hundred and ninety-nine.
5. Nine thousand, four hundred and eighty-two.

Now have a go at writing these numbers out in words.
